ABOUT THE FARM

The Fauquier Education Farm exists at the intersection of agriculture education and social responsibility.

The Fauquier Education Farm is a local 501 (c) 3 established in 2010. The farm exists to promote agriculture and agriculture-related education through best method demonstrations, classroom instruction, on-farm workshops, and hands-on learning. The farm supports the community through contributions of fresh produce to local food banks and providing richly rewarding volunteer opportunities.

The Farm is truly a unique community resource, serving Fauquier County and the entire Northern Piedmont. By promoting agricultural education through on-farm demonstrations and promoting agricultural best practices, they enable communities to produce fresh, healthy vegetables in an economically sustainable way.

While the Farm has a special focus on the beginning farmer, their audience ranges from students to those already experience with the skill. Interested participants of all ages and skill levels come to the farm to learn through hands-on demonstrations, seminars and to volunteer.

The Farm's community involvement is very beneficial. In the 2017 growing season, the Fauquier Education Farm grew and donated well over 60,000 pounds of high quality fresh produce to the Fauquier Food Bank, The Rappahannock Food Bank and The Fauquier Food Coalition.

The many pounds of produce donated to our local food banks last year were planted and harvested by a diversity of individuals. In 2017 the farm hosted over 400 volunteers with many of them being under the age of 16 and traveling from places as far away as Chesterfield, Buckingham, Caroline and Augusta counties. Through the farm's volunteer program, our next generation is not only learning agricultural best practices, but they are also learning how to give back to the community in which they live and play.

Many local businesses are partnering together to make this event possible and to raise funds for one of our important community partners. **Please mark your calendars and join us July 28th for this wonderful community event.**
